
1.6 Looking at the World - Comparing Regions

- 1. Which two countries have higher percentages of children who die before reaching age 5?
- 2. Which two countries have higher annual population growth rates?
- 3. In which two countries can people expect to live a longer life?
- 4. In which two countries can a majority of people read and write?
- B. What *patterns* can you identify from these *facts*?

There are four categories: Child mortality, population growth, life span and adult literacy. Based on this chart, which categories seem to go together in the world today?

- C. In your opinion, which *conclusion* below best explains these *patterns*?
