Before the introduction of the dollar as the money of account of the newly established United States in the years after the American Revolution, the residents of each colony had their own distinct colonial currencies. All were denominated in pounds, shillings and pence. In 1774, when the exchange rate between Boston and London was £135 Massachusetts currency per £100 sterling, £400 Massachusetts currency was equivalent to £296 sterling. £400 Massachusetts currency in 1774, when adjusted for inflation, works out to have been worth about \$28,000 United States currency in the year 2000.
